April 2019 – March 2020: A Year in view

What a year it has been....

I don't think that before this year started that we could have ever imagined that within just 12 months, we could be facing a major flood and a global pandemic but that is exactly what we have had to face during what has been a very challenging year for TOLFA, as it has for many around the world.

- **Monsoon Mayhem**

In August 2019, as a most probable result of the environmental crisis we all face, we experienced the full force of the monsoon when more rainfall fell than it has for decades. Ajmer's Ana Sagar Lake burst its banks, Pushkar Lake burst its banks and sadly our shelter faced the full brunt of this unprecedented rainfall. Unfortunately our older lower lying buildings just couldn't withstand the absolute deluge of water that fell and within a few hours our 40 Kennel, prep room & operation theatre, as well as our grounds were under a foot of water. We had no option but to evacuate the whole Rescue Kennel building and double up dogs in our kennels that were built on a higher platform. Our cows and donkeys we also had to take the areas of our hospital that were on higher ground. We were also forced to suspend operations except for the most urgent (which were performed in our dispensary operation

theatre) until we could get our facilities back to working order. The monsoon lasted well into October 2019, making working conditions very difficult indeed.



Much of the construction work for this year, centred around either managing the effects of the monsoon or taking the best advantage of what the monsoon brought with her.

RAIN WATER COLLECTION TANK



As soon as we could, we started the construction of a big Rainwater Collection Tank that would collect all the water run off from our huge cattle shade roof. It was important to us that we should not waste this precious resource and the tank has helped us to save on our water bills throughout the monsoon months and beyond as it also collect water from 2 of our water borings. As well as this we also connected a pipeline from our Education Centre / Office Roof, with the collected rainwater running into an already existing underground water tank. The rainwater collection tank was inaugurated on 4th October 2019 and was kindly sponsored by Mr Premchand Lunia.

NEW CALF ICU YARD



The monsoon caused a huge amount of damage to our old cement shades that covered our Calf and ICU area. As part of the damage limitation and also to serve the purpose for many years to come, we were able to replace the small cemented shade with a much stronger and hard wearing fibre coated metal shade. The shade was also extended significantly to cover more area in the yard so that even the heaviest rain couldn't reach under the shade and affect the vulnerable animals inside. The shade was inaugurated on 3rd December 2019 and was sponsored by members of The Lions Club International

MONSOON DAMAGE TO OWNER DOG KENNELS & SUBSEQUENT REPAIR



Our 13 Owner Kennel Block took a huge hammering in the monsoon as although the individual kennels had rooves, the whole of the block did not and so was open to the elements. With a generous donation from Mr V.S Bhati and Family, we were able to put a fibre coated metal shade over the whole block as well as renovate all of the individual kennels that were in need of repair. The works were completed in November 2019.

VISITORS ROOM / SECURITY GUARD ROOM



Over the years, the number of people making a visit to TOLFA has increased enormously. We are blessed to receive many one off but also returning visitors who enjoy the peaceful nature of TOLFA. We decided that it was necessary to build a room where we could both receive the visitors who had travelled far and wide to get to us and also take the time to explain all the facets of the work that we do. As well as a visitors room & bathroom, the space also doubles up as a room used by our Night Security Guard who ensures that the security of TOLFA is not breached at any time. The work on the Visitors Room was completed in March 2020

EDUCATION CENTRE SOLAR POWER INSTALLATION

In an effort to reduce all of our large utility bills at the TOLFA Animal Hospital and also to be part of the efforts to be as environmentally friendly as possible, on the 4th October 2019, we inaugurated a new Solar Power Installation that is situated on the roof of our Education Centre, Offices and Medical Store building. The Solar Power Installation was kindly sponsored by Dr Kirti Kumar Tamra and Family who showed great dedication in seeing the project through from start to completion.



.Not only did the monsoon this year make a massive impact on all of our infrastructure but it also forced us to change the way that we worked and no more so than with our Rescue & Care Project.

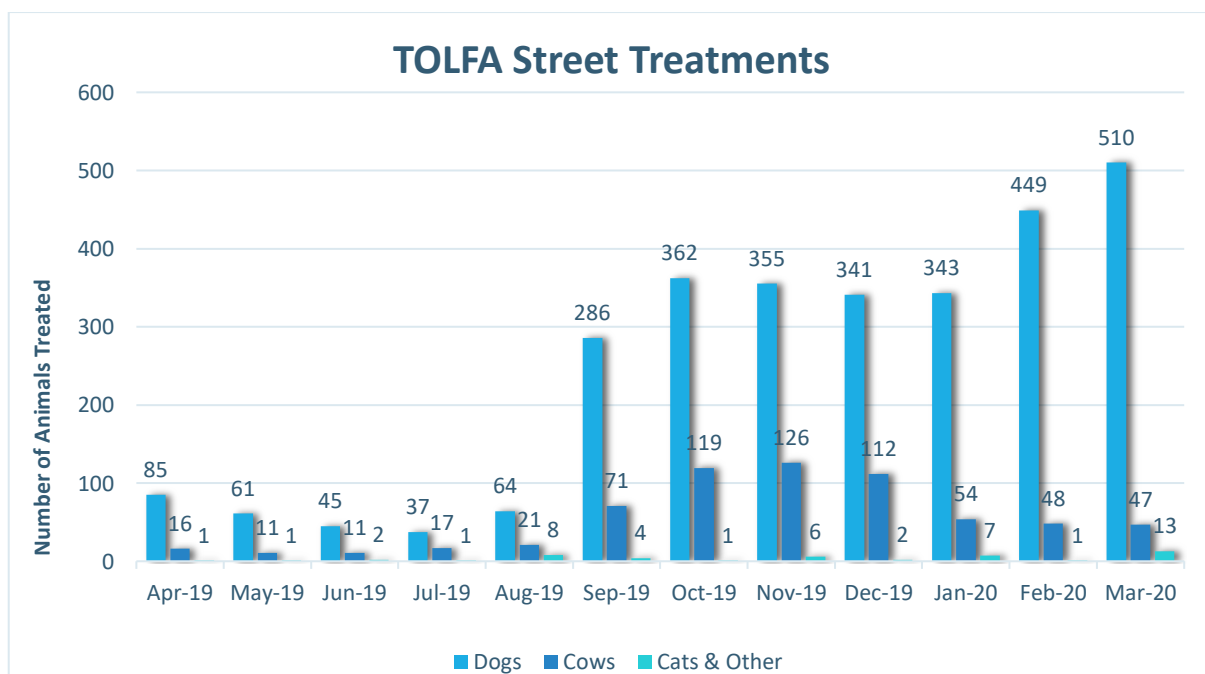
9,113 Sick & Injured Animals Assisted

During this period, a total of **5,475** animals were rescued by our ambulance and admitted to the TOLFA hospital for more extensive treatment.

A further **3,638** animals were given veterinary treatment on the streets.

With such a large part of our rescue kennels (40 Kennels) out of action due to the monsoon floods and it as always being our busiest time of year with 'maggot season' by September 2019 we faced a huge dilemma as we were starting to be seriously over capacity with rescue admissions. We made the very difficult decision to temporarily close admissions to all except for the most serious / emergency cases and for all other cases we instead reverted to 'street treatments', relying heavily on street animal care persons to monitor follow up care and let us know.

From the graph below, it can be seen how the 'street treatment's increased from an average of **76** treatments per month for the first 5 months to an average of **465** treatments per month, from September 2019.

HEALING FROM THE HEART – THE STORY OF THE BURNED BULL

We rescued this poor bull after a member of the public reported that a bulls skin was all shedding off and bleeding.

Back at the hospital, one of vets diagnosed severe burning from a hot liquid causing massive wounds and skin blistering. He must have been in agony. After giving him pain relief and IV fluids, we gave him a light sedative so that we could effectively debride all of the dead tissue and clean the wounds well and flush out any infection. We also gave him antibiotics to stop any further infection and applied aloe vera gel to cool the wound and encourage healing. After daily dressing for a week we were able to gradually extend the time between dressings, only applying gel. He was a gentle giant despite his size and we don't know why anyone would want to hurt him. The wounds healed well but he will be left with a permanent scar.

ABC & ANTI RABIES

TOLFA is committed to protecting animal and human populations by eradicating Rabies and humanely managing street dog numbers.

During this period TOLFA sterilised (ABC) **2,135** dogs and Rabies vaccinated a total of **2,435** dogs.

In August and September 2019, the monsoon had an effect on the number of operations that we could perform as the operation theatre and prep room were under 1 ft of water and therefore out of action.

To increase the pressure on the project even more, 3 out of 4 veterinary doctors resigned on very short notice and all at once, all to pursue a veterinary career in the government sector. It took a little while to recruit new doctors and so we had to manage as best we could. At the end of March 2020, we had to stop ABC catching because of Covid 19 lockdown. Despite this we still managed to sterilise only 235 less dogs from last year and rabies vaccinate 493 less dogs.

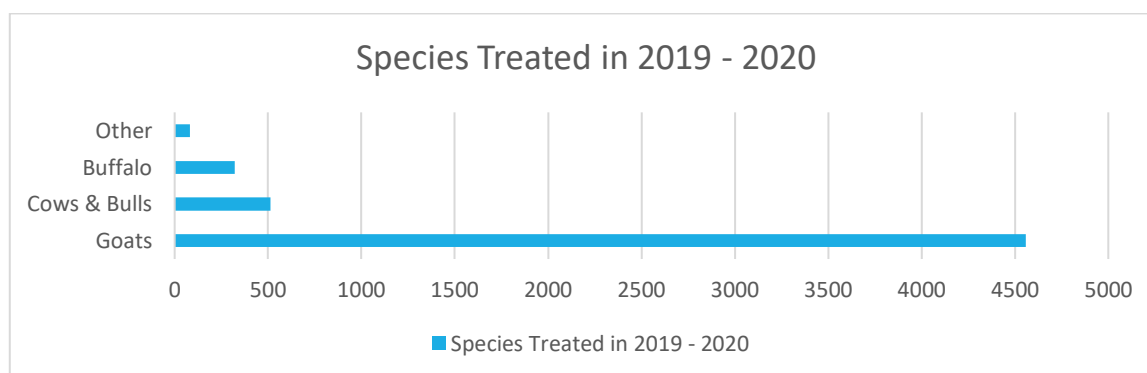

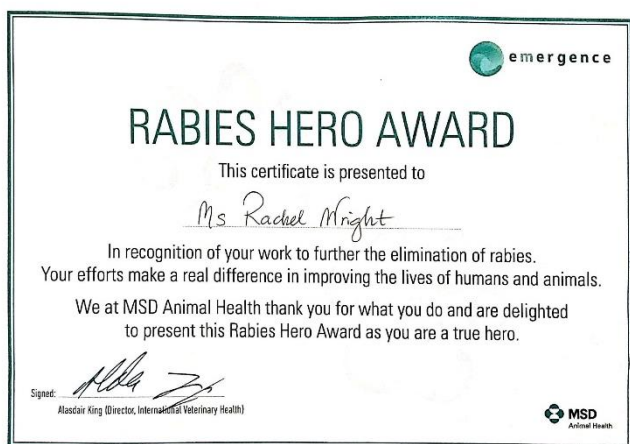

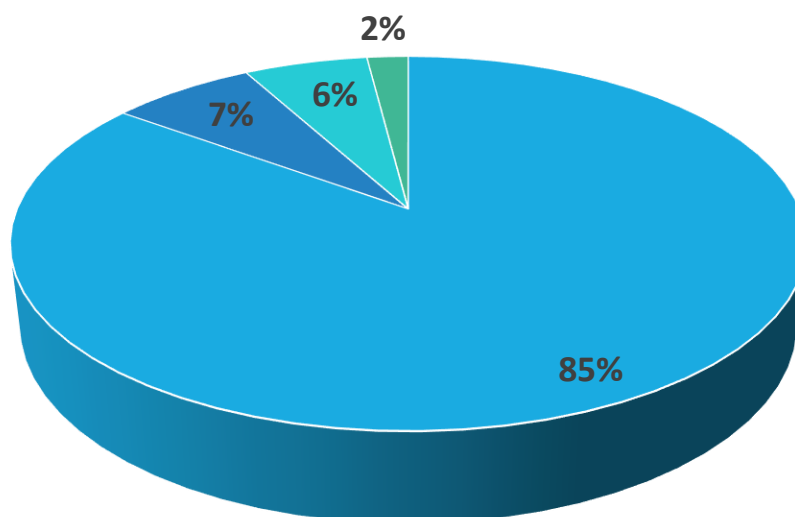
